My professional career has been in Marketing & PR. I took a break in 2000 to look after my two children and decided to concentrate on my art once they were more independent.

My early visual experimentation centered on the merging of medical science and art as a response to the personal experience of my Son's Bone Marrow Transplant. I rejoined Art Academia in 2012 to expand my knowledge and expertise in a variety of mediums, latterly specialising in encaustic painting and wax casting. I have continued my work with encaustic wax, pushing the boundaries to incorporate wax casting, mixed media and encaustic collograph. My work follows two key overarching themes; my fascination with the beauty in nature's patterns, the textures of decay in the unloved and abandoned in my environment. To the exploration of my personal responses to the human condition. I moved into a studio space at St George's Centre Studios on Portland in November 2016. From here I deliver one to one workshops in contemporary encaustic wax. I also teach small groups at the Dorset Creative Centre in Poundbury, and at various local workshops and art centres. Five of my original designs were included in the final selection. 500 new deck chairs were produced and installed on the promenade.
